

I happened to re-read Paolo Ongaro's editorial in the 26th edition of January-February 2019.

We were then at the beginning of our initiative with the Guild of Arts. The months of intense work meant sleepless nights and being away from the family, but they were useful.

Paolo Ongaro happily announced the birth of the guild, and as the founding members, we were excited to be able to finally work together to achieve a common purpose, with Giuliana Ricama who supported us and always placed a very important tool of knowledge at everyone's disposal.

We celebrated our first year and have come a long way, more than we could ever have imagined we would in such a short time.

Important partners are teaming up with us, and we are a point of reference for those looking for Art of Yarns professionals. Above all, we have been obtaining results that are valid for all the associates. It is always difficult to catch the attention of the institutions, but the guild is succeeding and our profession, seemingly unknown to most, is slowly becoming known. The expression, "Arti di Filo" (Art of Yarns), which we used in talking about ourselves during television broadcasts, is becoming commonplace and what we are narrating is becoming increasingly clear. The first teachers of the guild are working more successfully. Certainly, the merit absolutely goes to them, but it is equally true that being part of a cohesive group helps to clear impediments that are difficult to face alone. Thanks to Giuliana Ricama, we are also known abroad. Many contact us to find out more and to connect with us. Our path is still long, but less tiring when travelled together.

We receive numberless questions daily from those who want to join, and many doubts as well. Is it fair to have doubts? Sure! Every doubt is an enrichment for us, an obstacle that we overcome together.

Becoming a member of an association first is what we propose, and we may ask if it is the right one. We must initially determine what it offers, whether it suits us, and if it meets our needs.

Are we expert craftsmen because we are very good at producing and selling splendid products?

There are very well organized artisan associations with offices throughout Italy, and perfect consultants who can train and certify professionals.

We are Art of Yarns teachers, so we don't produce, but do we only teach? Yes, the Guild of Arts is the trade association to which we belong.

The requirements for joining the Guild of Arts are quite strict. Being a trade association, the law requires certain characteristics. It is not enough to be good, nor does it suffice to be familiar with thread techniques, or having been with other enthusiasts who have embroidered or worked with bobbins or knitting, even for years. You must have been a teacher for at least 3 years.

A teacher, be it a man or woman, is such because he or she has developed a teaching method that becomes useful to the teaching profession. The method focuses on the pupil, not the teacher. It is an accelerator of experience, a very fashionable term to define who helps to obtain results in a short time.

But can the profession as Art of Yarns teacher actually gain recognition?

Yes, it is our primary purpose. The Guild of Arts has made every effort to verify through the means established by law, that its members comply to the high-quality requirements that the Guild itself guarantees during the whole period that a teacher is a member. The Corporation can therefore issue for this purpose, the certificate of quality and qualification of the member's professional services.

What does it mean to work together? For example, organize many initiatives! We have to know that even if we are scattered all over Italy, everyone is very important for himself and for others.

The website of the cultural association, Geapolis, in collaboration with the Guild of Arts and Giuliana Ricama, dedicates a web site to the art of yarns. It offers insights and useful tools to accompany embroiderers and lace



makers through a self-assessment process. The goal is to allow everyone to personally document their skills and abilities by enhancing the specificity of their work and uniqueness of their products.

The proposal is part of the Open Construction Site of STEP BY STEP research action, a project that aims to experiment in contexts of non-formal and informal learning, and methodologies and tools useful to accompany adults through self-evaluation and evaluation paths. Among the research-action stakeholders, also the Guild of Arts will play an active role in the implementation and dissemination activities.
